**Principal duties and responsibilities:**

**Principal Duties**

The exact job specification will be tailored to suit the expertise and strengths of the jobholder and is likely to involve:

- some academic teaching or team-teaching (with support) at a level to be agreed, and the provision of curricular support to individuals outside the timetable;
- opportunities for a very good instrumentalist (and strong sight-reader) who can lead/coach young musicians by example, assisting with rehearsals and performances;
- advising and supporting pupils with their music practice;
- assisting with aural and theory tuition;
- assistance with a variety of roles within a busy department, including music librarianship, support for music exams, and the setting up for concerts/rehearsals;
- accompanying concert trips away from Oakham;
- recording and filming concerts (no prior experience required);
- other duties to support the work and administration of the Music Department

All Oakham staff are expected to take a full part in the life of this busy boarding school. It is likely that the position would have a pastoral element, and offer the opportunity to be a resident tutor in a boarding house.
