Senior Artist (f) as Female-Artist-in-Residence (FAiR) in Horn

From the **winter semester 2026/27**, we require a Senior Artist in the FAiR programme for the advancement of women at Mozarteum University (temporary, part-time) for a 6-month temporary employment contract.

Who can apply?

Outstanding young female horn players (classical orchestra, solo and chamber music) holding a completed, relevant artistic Master's or diploma degree who, in addition to an international career, also aspire to a career as a university professor.

Other requirements are:

- Concept paper (max. 2 sides of A4) for a project to carry out during the residence with the support of students at the Mozarteum University. We particularly welcome projects that contribute to making the repertoire more diverse and performance formats more innovative, those that critically examine artists' practices with regard to power and domination, and/or that promote democratic education.
- Good communication skills and ability to work as part of a team
- Very good written and spoken German and English

We expect the following from the residence holder:

- Regular work with students in horn classes (central artistic subject, instrumental and vocal pedagogy, pre-college, post-graduate, music education) on the specialist repertoire during individual and group lessons, audition training, chamber music rehearsals and workshops
- Completion of an independent project to be presented publicly on the premises of Mozarteum University Salzburg
- Regular work with students within the framework of the project
- Participation in further education/information and qualification opportunities
- Choosing Salzburg as your home for the duration of the residency.

We can offer the residence holder:

- Acquisition of teaching experience and a broad range of information and qualification offers under university structural framework conditions, strategies for career planning, competency training in self-management and self-marketing, etc.
- Support from one or more mentors
- The possibility of managing an artistic project independently using university facilities and networks.

The salary is based on the corresponding collective agreement for university employees in salary group **B1**. The employment level is 75%. The monthly salary is a minimum of **€2,832.08** gross (14x p.a.), and this may increase based on the provisions of the collective agreement and previous relevant experience. If necessary, an apartment/accommodation in the city of Salzburg will be provided as a benefit in kind for the duration of the employment relationship.

Travel and accommodation costs incurred as a result of the admission procedure cannot be reimbursed.

Mozarteum University Salzburg is striving to increase the number of women in research and teaching and, therefore, strongly encourages qualified artists to apply. Artists with disabilities, who are qualified, are also encouraged to apply.

Applications with the standard documents (informative CV including proof of relevant public artistic activity, certificates and a letter of motivation, to which a fully developed concept paper for a proposed project to be carried out during the residency is attached) must be submitted online by **12.04.2026** using the following link:

Selection process

The commission will preselect from the applications received in a prompt and correct manner. The selected candidates will each attend an interview on 04.06.2026. This will include an artistic presentation (the programme must include the 1st movement from Mozart's Horn Concerto KV 495 and can otherwise be freely selected), a demonstration lesson and the presentation of the project proposal.
