### HOW TO APPLY:

- Invitations to the audition will be sent after all applications have been reviewed.
- Invited applicants will be asked to **email acceptance** and **send a \$50.00 deposit check** to confirm their participation. Both the email and deposit check must be received on or before **September 4, 2026**. The check should be made payable to the **Lexington Philharmonic** and include 'Principal Horn Audition' along with your name on the check.

- All rounds of the audition will be held behind a screen
- The Lexington Philharmonic tunes to A=440hz
- The Audition Committee reserves the right to dismiss any applicant not meeting the highest professional standards at any time.
- Applicants must be able to provide documentation verifying U.S. citizenship or lawful authorization to work in the United States. The Lexington Philharmonic does not provide visa sponsorship for employment, including work visas.

**COMPENSATION:** The Lexington Philharmonic is a per service orchestra. During the 2025-2026 season the Principal Horn position was guaranteed a minimum of 28 services at the per service rate of \$134.75. Compensation rates and service guarantees for future seasons are established through the Collective Bargaining Agreement.

**TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT:** Partial travel/housing reimbursements are given to musicians living outside of Lexington, KY. We reimburse \$0.35 per mile driven, for up to 220 miles (round trip). We also provide a \$70 stipend for overnight accommodations in Lexington. Subsequent rates will be determined by the Collective Bargaining Agreement.

**CONCERT CYCLE SCHEDULE:** A typical concert cycle includes four evening rehearsals (Tuesday–Friday, 7:30–10:00pm) and a Saturday concert at 7:30pm.

**LEXINGTON PHILHARMONIC:** The Lexington Philharmonic (LexPhil) is a dynamic, evolving orchestra located in Lexington, Kentucky. Founded in 1961, LexPhil is central Kentucky’s largest professional music organization, serving a diverse population in central, southern, and eastern Kentucky.
