

RSCP (Regina Symphony Chamber Players) Job Description

The RSCP is the full-time core contingent of the larger Regina Symphony Orchestra, composed of 13 musicians:

Highly visible representatives of the Regina Symphony Orchestra, the RSCP musicians perform as Principal/Assistant Principal players in all Regina Symphony Orchestra performances. Members of the RSCP are responsible for the orchestra's chamber music presentations, both as a complete ensemble and in smaller groups, and have historically been offered opportunities to take the spotlight as solo artists.

Alongside traditional orchestral leadership duties (bowings, audition panels, extra musician lists, etc.), chamber music is an extremely important element (approximately half) of the RSCP's work, supporting the RSO's community engagement goals and strategic priorities. Chamber music rehearsals are musician-led and, as the specific demands of chamber music require particular skills, leadership, creativity, passion, and compassion, are highly valued qualities in our musicians.

The RSCP works as a group and plays a central role in the programming of chamber music events including:

- Chamber Players at Government House (a 6-program series, 12 concerts)
- Library Concert Series
- Education Concerts
- Community & Outreach Performances

RSCP musicians play an integral role in advancing the RSO's mission of strengthening community through transformative orchestral experiences that reflect and advance the cultural vibrancy of Regina and southern Saskatchewan.
