About the Role:

SMA operates over 30 Saturdays of the academic year (during term time) from Birkdale Senior School, S10 3DE. Concerts take place outside the normal teaching timetable, and staff are expected to attend in order to support their ensembles and all SMA young people.

You will deliver engaging clarinet and saxophone tuition in a variety of settings including:

- 1:1 lessons
- Small group and ensemble teaching

- Confidently introducing beginners to the clarinet/saxophone and supporting their early musical development.
- Supporting small wind ensembles by encouraging students, offering help as required, and ensuring groups remain focused and engaged.



- Promote a safe, inclusive, and supportive environment to encourage young musicians to take up the clarinet or saxophone.
- Availability to work 30 Saturdays per academic year in Sheffield.
- Availability to support SMA concerts where required.
