- Applicants wishing to audition must apply by **11:59pm Eastern Time on October 24, 2025**.

- All applications will be reviewed after 10/24/2025, and invitations to the audition will be emailed out on or before October 31, 2025.
- Invited applicants will be asked to **email acceptance** and **send a \$50.00 deposit check**. Both the email and deposit check must be received on or before **November 12, 2025**, or you will no longer be guaranteed an audition spot. The check should be made payable to the **Lexington Philharmonic** and include 'Principal Trombone' along with your name in the check's memo.

Deposit checks will be returned to candidates when they check-in on the audition day. Checks will not be returned to candidates who withdraw less than seven days prior to the audition date.

- The Lexington Philharmonic tunes to A=440hz
- We do not accept CDs, DVDs, or other electronic recordings in lieu of a live audition.
- All applicants must be able to demonstrate U.S. citizenship or eligibility to work in the U.S.

POSITION INFORMATION

COMPENSATION: The Lexington Philharmonic is a per service orchestra. During the 2025-2026 season the Principal Trombone position is guaranteed a minimum of 28 services at the per service rate of \$134.75. Rates and service guarantees for subsequent seasons are determined in the Collective Bargaining Agreement.

TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT: Partial travel/housing reimbursements are given to musicians living outside of Lexington, KY. We reimburse \$0.35 per mile driven, for up to 220 miles (round trip). We also provide a \$70 stipend for overnight accommodations for days that you stay in Lexington.

CONCERT CYCLE SCHEDULE: For a typical concert cycle, we rehearse 4 days (Tuesday through Friday, 7:30 - 10pm) with a concert on Saturday @ 7:30pm.
