Led by **internationally renowned professors** and under the Honorary Presidency of Her Majesty Queen Sofía, each year around 150 students from over 35 nationalities have the opportunity to study in an inspiring environment in the heart of Madrid.

At the School, we support our students in developing their curiosity, nurturing their motivation to imagine and **build their own artistic project**, one that contributes to and reflects on the present context, both within and beyond the traditional boundaries of classical music, and thereby contributes to the development and growth of the musical ecosystem and society.

With **more than 300 concerts annually and a merit-based free tuition system**, the Reina Sofía School of Music offers unparalleled opportunities for those who wish to discover and transform both the world and themselves through their **passion and musical talent.**





Personalised Teaching

Each student benefits from a fully personalised training plan, with 10 hours of individual instrument lessons per month and 4 with a dedicated pianist. Additionally, they participate in an intense chamber music and orchestral programme, including contemporary ensembles, historical performance, and choir. With small group sizes in all subjects and individual tutoring, the Reina Sofía School of Music guarantees close and personalised attention, allowing each musician to develop their full artistic potential.

With an acceptance rate of 9%, the School has established itself internationally as a benchmark for young musicians.

The small size of our community allows for close and individualised attention, resulting in exceptional training where each musician receives the necessary support and guidance throughout their learning journey, enabling them to develop their full potential.

Each student participates in an average of 20 concerts per year at the School, recorded in the highest quality of image and sound. The School has established partnerships with Spain's most important venues, such as the National Auditorium, Fundación Juan March or Auditorio 400, among others, providing our students with a unique opportunity to connect with the musical ecosystem and perfect their skills through live performance.

92% of our alumni quickly enter the professional market, performing on prestigious stages and with renowned ensembles. Our Artistic Development and Entrepreneurship programmes train students to define and develop their artistic and professional careers. Contributing to artistic individualisation, and through the design and execution of real projects, we provide the necessary tools to successfully navigate the ever-changing musical world.

Free tuition

At the Reina Sofia School of Music, **all students benefit from free tuition**, ensuring that the only requirement for admission is talent. The actual cost of a year of training is valued at €45,000, but students are only required to pay €1,200 as a reservation fee. Combined with the affordable cost of living in Madrid, the School offers a unique opportunity to receive a top-level education without financial barriers.

We also provide **various forms of support** that enable our students to focus on their artistic and professional development:

- **Artistic Fees:** Students may receive compensation for some of their performances in the School's concert series.
- **Meal assistance:** The School has an agreement with an establishment that offers students daily meals at a very low price.
- **Employment Opportunities:** Throughout the academic year, students have the chance to work on a paid basis in activities, workshops, and concerts organised by the School and managed through an internal Job Bank.
- **Accommodation Scholarships:** Some of the School's sponsors offer scholarships to cover students' accommodation and living expenses. The awarding of these scholarships is subject to the criteria established annually by the sponsors and requires a separate application process from admission.
- **Health Insurance:** The School covers the annual cost of private health insurance for students who are not EU citizens.
- **Administrative Support:** The School provides ongoing assistance and advice to students in managing the paperwork and documentation necessary for their stay in Spain.
- **Financial Support:** Beyond these aids, if a student needs to apply for a loan to cover living expenses in Madrid, the School will guide them through the entire administrative process, ensuring the loan application is straightforward and in the most favourable conditions.

Modern facilities in the heart of Madrid

The Reina Sofía School of Music is located in the iconic Plaza de Oriente, in the very **heart of historic Madrid**, next to the Royal Palace. Madrid is home to important concert halls and theatres, such as the National Auditorium, Teatro Real, Teatro Monumental, Auditorio 400 and Fundación Juan March. The city also hosts four major symphony orchestras (RTVE, OCNE, ORCAM, OSM) and is home to renowned museums such as the Prado, Thyssen-Bornemisza and Reina Sofía.

The School, situated in a **modern 5,000m² building**, provides students with an ideal environment for their development. We offer classrooms of various sizes, fully equipped practice rooms, advanced audiovisual facilities, a specialised library, and an **auditorium with a capacity for 351 spectators**, where students can perfect their skills and share it with the public.

Known for being a vibrant, multicultural, and cosmopolitan city, Madrid offers a **welcoming lifestyle**, a rich cultural and culinary scene, and pleasant weather throughout the year.

Exceptional performing opportunities

Learning on stage is a key principle of our teaching. The **more than 300 concerts** organised by the School each academic year provide students with **the opportunity to play in a variety of stage formats**. In this way, students regularly gain the valuable experience of performing in public, whether in the School's auditorium or on other stages. In recent years, our students have performed in venues such as the Musikverein in Vienna, the Liszt Ferenc Academy of Music in Budapest, the Reduta Hall in Bratislava, the National Auditorium of Music in Madrid, the Teatro Real in Madrid, the Gran Teatre del Liceu in Barcelona, and the Roman Theatre of Mérida. In November 2025, the School's Orchestra will debut at Carnegie Hall in New York.

ADMISSION PROCESS

1st round. Preselection

The Selection Committee will evaluate the transcript of records and the audiovisual material of each candidate and will select those who pass to the next auditions round.

2nd round. Auditions

The auditions for the selected applicants will be in person at the School.

Please take a moment to find out each chair specific requirements, as they might differ between teachers.

Audition fee: €30 to be paid before the audition.

3rd round. Entrance exam to the Bachelor's Degree in Music

To access the official studies of the Bachelor of Music degree course (Grado en Enseñanzas Artísticas Superiores de Música), a specific entrance exam established by the local education administration (Autonomous Community of Madrid) must be taken after the auditions. The contents of this test will be directly related to the disciplines of each course. This test will take place on **22 June 2026** at the School and it must be undertaken in person.

STRUCTURE OF THE AUDITIONS

1) Performance test

Each teacher has specific repertoire requirements which should be consulted in the following pages.

If after listening to all auditionees the panel is still undecided the applicant may be asked to have a lesson with the principal teacher. This is neither a requirement nor is it compulsory, but it is only an additional means that the audition panel might use if it is felt it will assist them in reaching a final decision.

2) Music Theory test

Candidates selected after the audition must take a theory and a practical test to assess their level in case they are admitted. Taking these tests does not imply admission to the School.

Music Theory test

A comprehensive test of music history, musical analysis, and ear training.

- Music History:

Aural recognition test of different historical musical styles, from the Renaissance to the 21st century, indicating aspects of form, tonality, style, instrumentation, etc.

- Musical Analysis:

Harmonic and form analysis of an instrumental piece from the classical or romantic period.

- Aural Harmony:

Test of the knowledge of the theoretical foundations in terms of tonalities and construction of intervals and chords: type, inversions, chord progressions, cadences, etc.

- An individual test of Aural Training:

1. Aural Training:

Absolute and relative pitch test.

Intervallic, melodic, polyphonic and harmonic listening.

Dictation and practical exercises of construction of intervals, triads and chords.

2. Rhythmic test:

Assessment of rhythmic comprehension, realisation and coordination with progressive difficulty, including different polyrhythmic combinations.
